Dear Sirs:

I hope you have realized by now that I meant what I said when I told you on August 13, 2007 that I do not intend to buy my own book (The Eternal Perspective), or encourage my friends and family members to buy it. Therefore, you are not going to make any money on my book unless you begin to promote and market it to someone other than me. Based on our past correspondence, it appears to me that you have no intention of doing that, so why not cut your losses and terminate this contract now? I'm surprised you don't seem to see the wisdom of that course of action. For one thing, you wouldn't have to send me any more semi-annual royalty statements.

As you well know from our past correspondence, I signed a contract with your company because your web site and your contract led me to believe that you were a "traditional publisher" that made money by selling my book to the public—not to me. I'm sure I don't have to remind you of what you said in the "Frequently Asked Questions" section of your web site: that an author's obligations are "few" and "minimal"; that "The author has really only one obligation: to provide us with the completed final-version manuscript. We'll take it from there." And of course, prominently displayed at the beginning of the FAQs: "We want your book, not your money." You now have my book, and you don't have my money. Nor will you ever get any of my money. But since you appear to be doing nothing with my book, I would really like to have it back. Please consider terminating this contract, for the good of both of us, so we can both move on to bigger and better things.
